Scotsville School of Crafts – Plan of Activities 2024

For the purpose of this annual plan of activities, please note that the use of the SSC facility is ongoing by both the Lake Ainslie Weavers & Crafts Guild and the Quilting Bee Guild. Scotsville School of Crafts is a facility in Scotsville, Nova Scotia owned and operated by the Lake Ainslie Weavers and Crafts Guild, which is centrally located for the communities of Inverness, Whycocomagh, We'koqma'q, and the Margarees. The facility sits on 1.25 acres of land, has a parking lot, wheelchair access, a weaving studio, a gallery space, two large workshop spaces; one serves as a seasonal Retail Space and the other for community programming.

Communications, Advocacy & Membership Development

With the support of Cape Breton Centre for Craft & Design, the Scotsville School of Crafts will launch a new website to house information about the School and its craft and art programming activities. We will launch a new brand and logo to convey our vision for the future of the organization.

We will advocate and apply for operational funding through the Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism & Heritage and the Municipality of Inverness County.

We will continue to develop a membership campaign to encourage new members to the School. This will include print, online and in-person activities.

Craft Educational Programming 2024

Program planning is ongoing, but included here is an outline of proposed programming to date. We hope to add to this roster as new opportunities, instructors, and potential courses & workshops are identified throughout the year.

January/February 2024

Woolly Wednesdays (Year round)

Weekly gatherings of the resident Quilting Bee Guild and Woolley Wednesday Fibre Arts group as winter weather permits. These drop-in sessions are open to guild members and the general public alike. All abilities and experience are welcome. Friends, fibre, and a cuppa!

March 2024

Weaving – Beyond Beginners, 6 weeks – Eileen MacNeil, Instructor. This course is intended for those who have some prior knowledge of weaving. It is intended to build on the skills from Weaving for Beginners course. Participants are expected to be able to prepare a warp and dress their loom with assistance.

Handmade Greeting Cards, 3-4hr workshop – Anne Peters, Instructor

Participants will learn to create their own unique handmade greeting cards for any occasion.

Needle Felted Landscape Postcard, 4-6 hrs over two sessions – Claire Keigan, Instructor Participants will learn the basics of needle felting and create their own wooly landscape postcard.

Introduction to Table Loom - 3 weeks - Jenni Beaton, Instructor A brief introduction to weaving on a table loom. Designed for beginners to explore the fascinating world of loom weaving on a smaller scale.

April 2024

Introduction to Spinning, 4weeks – Judy Lincoln, Instructor Participants will learn the various steps and techniques to prepare and spin wool from the raw fleece to finished yarn.

Drop Spindle Spinning – Eileen Rickard, Instructor As a complement to the Introductory Spinning course, Eileen will guide participants through the techniques of using a drop spindle. Pre-dating the spinning wheel, these portable and versatile spindles were used throughout history and throughout the world.

Introduction to Rigid Heddle Loom Weaving – 1 day (9am-4pm) – Sandra Gillis – Instructor In this one-day workshop participants will have the opportunity to experience weaving on a rigid heddle loom – from preparing the warp, dressing the loom to a variety of techniques possible with this versatile little loom.

Painting from Photos – Miranda Crabtree, Instructor Miranda will lead participants in exploring techniques and media in creating unique paintings from a photo subject of their choice.

Soapmaking – 2 days – Mary Pemberton, Instructor

Rich, luxurious tallow soap from local ingredients. Participants will learn all the steps in the process of creating these handmade bars of soap. Mary believes making our own is a fundamental skill all humans deserve to learn. Good clean fun!

May 2024

Lunch & Learn Working Bee - Dye Garden (community activity) We will observe how our dye garden fared over the winter, perform some garden maintenance, and plan and plant for future expansion. Healthy local lunch provided.

Macrame for Beginners, 6 weeks, Dylan Parkhurst – Instructor This course is designed for people of all abilities and knowledge of macrame. No experience is

required in any fiber art. Just a willingness "to take chance, make mistakes, and get messy" Miss. Frizzle (Magic School Bus). This course will take place over a six week period as we learn different knots and techniques all the while making some beautiful macrame projects.

June 2024

World Wide Knit In Public Day – Saturday, June 8th, 2024 This day we celebrate the passion for knitting and show it to the world. It's not everybody who is so fortunate to have someone to sit together to share company and knitting. It's a human need to be together with others and spending time together sharing the inspiration, the curiousity and the creativity.

June 30th, 2024

International Back-to-Back Wool Challenge. A team consists of seven (7) handspinners and knitters and 1 blade shearer. The objective is to complete a sweater following the same pattern within 8 hours. Funds raised support cancer research and local palliative care.

July 2024

Spinning Flax – Jennifer Green- Professor NSCAD and Flaxmobile Project – Instructor A one-day workshop to introduce spinning locally grown long line flax fibre into yarn. Participants in this workshop are expected to have a basic knowledge of spinning in order to get the most from the day.

Sea Glass Greeting Card Workshop – Instructor Jeanne Engel Participants will create uniquely whimsical greeting cards incorporating sea glass.

August 2024

40th Anniversary Celebrations – Scotsville School of Crafts – Lake Ainslie Weavers and Craft Guild. Come celebrate with us! We'll be hosting an open house with a wide variety of demonstrations, Try It for Yourself! Test Drives, mini workshops, artisan profiles, craft market, and, of course, cake! From drafting your pattern to cutting your wool strips to creating even loops and special effects, Eileen will guide participants through each step as they create their own mini rug.

Decorative Embroidery - 4 weeks – Sarah Faber, Instructor Participants will learn a variety of basic embroidery stitches as they create one of a kind embellished embroidery creations.

October 2024

Did you know the first jigsaw puzzle was a dissected map of the counties of England that was used as a teaching aid in the early 1700's? The first puzzles were cut using a coping saw. Today these high-end heirloom puzzles are cut on a scroll saw with a blade no thicker than a horse's hair. Come see a demonstration on how it is done, see examples of old and new puzzles, and learn a little history of the art.
